

### **OBITUARY**

On April 9, 1926, Mildred Marie Williams was born on Pittsburgh's North Side. The historic neighborhood would serve as the main setting of her story, from the beginning to the peaceful end.

Nicknamed "Millie", she was the eldest child of Edith "Sis" Williams. As a young woman, she befriended Russell Blackburn. The pair eventually fell in love and married on June 30, 1951. They both became members of The Church of Our Savior United Methodist Church. Millie was a devoted Women's Society and Golden Leaf Club member. Church of Our Savior was Mildred's church home for over 30 years before joining Calvary United Methodist Church in the late 90s.

Millie's devotion to her family ran deep! She was always willing to be a presence for anyone in her relation. She was in the mix whether it was family reunion planning, flowers for loved ones, Christmas sing-a-longs on Maple Avenue or impromptu parties at 113 Carrington Street. Millie couldn't be kept away from the annual Oktoberfest or Fourth of July cookouts at 120 Carrington. Millie showed up for others, especially at life-changing events like graduations, weddings, high school dances, marching band performances, pageants, christenings, and dissertation defenses.
